## This day in history:

- On April 28, 1789, Captain William Bligh and 18 loyal crewmen of the HMS Bounty were set adrift off the coast of Tahiti in a 23' open boat. After a voyage lasting 47 days, they reached the island of Timor in the Dutch East Indies and then England to report the mutiny on the Bounty.
- In 1869, Chinese and Irish laborers, working together for the Central Pacific Railroad, completed 10-miles of track in one day, setting a feat which has never been matched.
- In 1947, 5 Norwegians and a Suede named Thor Heyerdahl set off in the raft Kon-Tiki
  from Peru in an attempt to prove that the Polynesian Islands were settled in a similar way
  thousands of years ago.
- And, in 1986, the United States Navy aircraft carrier USS Enterprise successfully navigated through the Suez Canal without getting stuck.

- Gordon also noted that the current Rotary magazine has a great article about the malaria project.

- Judge Linda Healy reported that she originally had no fines to levy, but she just heard a

- Bruce offered \$5 for a triple happy fine that he said would take a little time. In addition to reminding us that Duke Ellington's birthday was this week, he also noted that the Pirates are ahead of the Cubs and the Cards. That may not last long, so he needed to emphasize it while he could.

### **Program:**

Today's speaker was Marianne Manko, Public Affairs Coordinator for McLean County Health Department. Much of her presentation focused on current statistics and vaccination procedures in the county, including exploring the reasons that some may be hesitant to receive the COVID-19 vaccination. At the time, we were still in Phase 4, and she reminded us that once we moved into the bridge phase, we would need to be in the bridge for 28 days before we can advance to Phase 5.

That week, McLean County reached a critical mass in the demand for the vaccine. While the Health Department thought that this process would be gradual, they suddenly had open appointments that weren't filling. This was true not just in McLean County but also in some other counties. So beginning on April 27, all vaccine clinics were opened for walk-ins. Many of those were Pfizer clinics, so they were able to vaccinate those from age 16 and up.

Marianne pointed out the distinct differences between vaccine hesitancy and vaccine equity. Their staff created a group to examine what the barriers have been to receiving a vaccine. They expected that the African-American and Hispanic communities would have higher levels of hesitance but found that this was not the case at all. Most of the concerns for these groups were about equity: Were they able to receive explanations in their first language, for example, if Spanish speakers? Where they found the most hesitancy was in Caucasian middle-aged men who identify themselves as conservative, so they have adjusted some of their public messaging to address this – for example, running spots during the WEEK and WMBD morning shows.
