Program: Our speaker was Dr. Kristen Weikle, superintendent of Unit 5 schools. She discussed the April 4 Unit 5 school referendum. (In the interest of accuracy, some of the info below is adapted from the Unit 5 website.)

Over the years, Unit 5 has felt the squeeze from inflation of school expenses, increased state mandates and decline in state funding. If the referendum is successful, the increase in the district's education fund will be offset by reductions in building bonds and working cash and bonds.

In an effort to address an \$11 million deficit, the Unit 5 school board has already approved cuts for 2023-24, including reductions in administration, budgets for buildings and curriculum, field trips, sports, technology and more. Also, the school board voted to increase registration, activity and gate fee and facility rental fees. These cuts total only about \$2 million.



Dr. Weikle said that if the April 4 referendum is successful, the district will be able to responsibly solve its financial challenges, reinstate programs that the board has cut and provide safer and improved learning environments. If the referendum is approved, this will give the district the sustainable funding needed now and into the future, and will allow the district to no longer have to rely on working cash bonds to fund operations.

If the referendum fails, Unit 5 can expect cuts in teachers, administrators and support staff; elimination of clubs, athletics, music and art; and fewer enrichment and non-mandatory classes.






Dr. Weikle said Unit 5's tax rate for operating funds is less than other nearby districts.

Early voting begins Feb. 23. An informational meeting will be held in-person on March 8. And April 4 is election day.
