President Ryan Fleming convened the April 12, 2023, meeting of the Normal Rotary Club at the ISU Alumni Center. President Ryan also gave the invocation.



**Program:** Rotarians Hank Campbell and Surinder Sethi talked about their trip to India last January as part of the Rotary Friendship Exchange with District 3040. The exchange is a way to build friendships

between Rotarians of different countries and cultures. Hank and Surinder attended their hosts' district conference in Agra. Due to a family emergency, Surinder had to leave, but Hank soldiered on alone. Hank's hosts took good care of him, he said.

People think of the U.S. as a diverse country, but India is really, really diverse, Surinder said. In India, you'll find speakers of at least 36 different languages, not to mention the dialects, cultures and traditions that those languages reflect.

About 1,000 Rotarians plus family members attended the district conference, Hank said.



Attendees listened to remarks from district governor candidates and then took a vote to decide the



winner. In our own district 6490, a committee interviews district governor candidates and decides on the nominee.

After the district conference, Hank traveled to several other communities, including Bhopal, the site of a 1984 chemical disaster whose consequences reverberate to this day. His visits included a Red Cross hospital, a cancer hospital, schools, an 8,000-year-old Buddhist site, tree-planting projects and a water-harvesting project. Most of these were Rotary projects. Normal Rotary participated in an effort to provide one community with an ambulance that is expected to save 400-500 lives per year.

Hank said he was warmly received by his Indian hosts, and his visits received a lot of PR. During interviews, Hank tried to be "the face of Rotary" and to advocate for RAM Global.

For three days starting June 10, District 6490 will host visitors from India. They will visit Bloomington-Normal, Champaign-Urbana and Decatur. We'll need help in hosting and/or transporting our guests.
