**Program:** Our speaker was Jeff Mavros. Jeff is the Executive Director of Admissions and Recruitment Marketing at Illinois State University. Jeff's role is to recruit students to the undergraduate programs. Admissions and Recruitment has short term goals of targeting an enrollment of 20-21,000 students, increasing the university's academic profile and increasing diversity on campus. The historic market for recruiting has been Illinois residents, primarily white, public high school graduates, academically prepared and mid-to high income. Top competition for recruits has traditionally been UIUC, UIC,





DePaul, NIU, Iowa, College of DuPage, Bradley, Loyola, SIUE and EIU. Recruiting uses messaging that includes: Comfortable, warm and welcoming, fun, exciting, big school opportunities, affordability, preparation for the future, return on investment.

The total cost for ISU is in the lower half of the Illinois public universities with the ROI in the top half. Target Audiences include high school students, starting with sophomore year, parents (single greatest influence on recruits) and families of recruits, community college students, underrepresented and high achieving. Recruitment efforts include the ease of application, digital marketing, direct mail and on campus experience.

Fall of 2022 was the University's largest incoming class with 200+ students from McLean County and also earned the title of most diverse freshman class. Challenges to recruitment include heightened price sensitivity, student out-migration, perceived value of degrees and fewer high school graduates.
