



Program: Rotarian Mark Jontry presided over the club's presentation of awards to Jan Meadows and to Mike Romagnoli.

Jan received the Jim Collie Vocational Service Award, which recognizes people who have distinguished themselves in their occupation, who are dedicated to serving others and who demonstrate high ethical standards in their occupation.

Rotarian Becky Goeckner presented the award and reviewed Jan's achievements. Jan worked for 35 years as a behavior specialist and teacher in Unit 5 schools. For 20 years she taught night courses at ISU, and she continues to mentor student teachers and honor students at ISU.

Jan has chaired the Back 2 School Alliance which provides thousands of backpacks with school supplies to low-income families in the community. She has been active in the Promise Council, an independent school support program. She created a 10-week course called WOW to develop leadership skills and confidence in elementary school-aged girls. For many years, she served on the executive committee of the Unit 5 Education Association, and she is vice president for the IEA Retired Teachers.

Mike received the Jack Wilz Public Health and Safety Award, which recognizes people whose actions benefit the public health and/or safety of the community. Mike is executive director of the Community Health Care Clinic, which provides healthcare to uninsured and under-insured people.

Rotarian Hank Campbell presented the award to Mike and summarized the health care clinic's achievements. The clinic was started in 1994 after local leaders realized that many people who could

not afford regular health care were showing up repeatedly at emergency facilities. Today, the not-for-profit clinic serves 1,400 patients a year, providing primary health care, health education and wellness programs. An onsite dispensary provides prescription medications. Hank recognized that the clinic's success relies on a dedicated staff and volunteers.

Mike became executive director of the Community Health Care Clinic in 2018. Mike had started at the clinic as a volunteer 14 years previously and worked in several positions there, including operations manager.
